Community Council Elections

Community Councils are the first tier of Local Government, there are more than 700 Community Councils in Wales and 8000 community councillors. Elections for Community Councils are held every five years, with the next election taking place on 5th May 2022.

Wick Community Council has seven councillors, some of whom will be seeking re-election in May, whilst others are standing down. The final meeting of the current council will take place on Thursday 17th March.

Nomination packs for anyone interested in standing to be a councillor can be found on the Wick Community Council website, the Vale Council website or email, wickcommunitycouncil@gmail.com for one to be sent to you. Completed nomination forms must be submitted to the Vale Council by 5th April.

Wick Community Council meets once a month on the third Thursday of each month and councillors can attend either in person or via zoom.

Play Rangers and activities for young people

The value of play activities for children and young people is well documented and the Community Council is pleased to work with Wick Youth Club, the Vale Play Rangers and Play Wales to enhance play opportunities.

Over recent years the Community Council has sourced over £5,000 in grants to purchase play equipment for use in the community, much of this is available to be borrowed by groups in the village.

We have arranged additional Play Ranger attendance at the village this year and they will be back for the summer holidays, but they can't be here every week.

The Community Council is pleased to announce that the Vale Play Rangers and Wick Youth Club will start a new project this month to encourage parents and older young people to run their own play sessions using the Community Council's equipment. Full training will be available, and details will be circulated on the village hub or you can register your interest by email to
